Additionally intensive supervision will be guaranteed through the University occupational therapy teaching assistants and faculty members. This course will be dedicated for psychosocial occupational therapy practice as a practical extension for OT 3331 (Occupational Therapy self, lab work and Counseling) & OT 336 (Occupational Therapy Applied for Psychosocial dysfunction)</p>
